Harvest Service

Branscombe Project

The Branscombe Project are in the process of developing an interactive map of Branscombe which will include local people's comments about places in Branscombe. The children have been involved in this process and many of them have submitted some lovely comments about their favourite places in the village. The project organisers have come up with a number of possible ways in which the children's contributions can be displayed, but we now need parental input. Attached to this newsletter (along with the other permission forms) is a list of choices and a permission form. Please read through the choices and let us know which you would be happy to provide permission for (choose more than one if you would like to). If we do not hear from you, we will assume that you do not wish your child's comments to be included.

Home Learning

During the recent staff training days we looked together at our policy relating to Home Learning. Across The Jubilee Federation, staff recognise that pupils who have spent a busy structured day at school need time to relax and unwind at the end of the afternoon. We are also mindful of the need to encourage children to pursue out-of-school activities e.g. swimming, ballet, music lessons, Cubs, Brownies etc.

We believe that home learning should be used to effectively reinforce and/or extend what is learned in school. Home learning is planned to be meaningful. We hope that children will feel a sense of personal satisfaction in a task completed well and that their efforts will be recognised and praised both at home and at school. This approach aims to support children's growing perception about their ability to complete a task outside the school environment. It also fosters the skills of independent learning.

We all recognise the importance of providing positive feedback to the children and, being generous in our praise, within the context of our expectations of each pupil's achievement. We encourage children to follow up an aspect of school work by visiting different sources of information e.g. local library, the internet, etc.

We want the children to think of this work as valuable and as a challenge. It should be undertaken to the best of their ability and following usual classroom presentation expectations.

Your children will shortly receive their Home Learning Exercise book for the year. The way we share tasks with you will be slightly different. Your class teacher will let you know about the routine relating to the day of the week that you will receive the task and the day each week that tasks need to be completed by. Each week in the Home Learning book you will find a slip that describes the task and also the areas that are going to be covered in class each week so that you see the context that the work has been set in.

We hope that you enjoy working with your child on the tasks. The full new policy will be on the school website shortly, or you can ask for a copy from the school office.

School Meals

The cost of school meals has increased slightly this year. Each meal will now cost £2.30.

National Trust Bat walk - Thursday 10th Sept 7pm - 9pm (meet at Branoc Hall)

Ranger Ruby and Helen Parr from the Devon Greater Horseshoe Bat Project are running a Branscombe bat hunt for Branscombe school children and their parents. Places are limited. This will initially be open to Branscombe school children and an accompanying parent only. This may be extended to other family members nearer the date, depending on numbers. Booking is essential, please complete the slip attached to this newsletter if you and your child would like to attend, and return to the office by Monday next week.

Clubs

Clubs will be starting up again next week. Details of each club can be found below. If your child(ren) would like to take part, please complete the relevant slip below and return to the office. Only children for whom we have a completed permission slip will be able to take part in each club (even if your child has attended in the past).

If any parents feel that they have a useful skill and would be interested in helping to run a related club (either an existing one or a new one) please do let us know.

Running Club

Mr Ford would like to propose a new Tuesday lunchtime running club for KS2 children. The children would change into their PE kit and go out running as soon as morning lessons finish at 12pm, and then return to eat lunch. They would therefore require a packed lunch on this day. If your child is interested in taking part, please fill in the form below. We will see if there is sufficient interest before we make a decision about whether the club will run.

Ukulele Club

This will run on Wednesday lunchtimes (12.30-1pm) for year 3 and above.

The day came when Jesus was on trial for his very life. He needed his friend to stand by him. But Peter said "I don't know him, I never knew him, I never saw him before."


And at the end of the day a cock crowed.....just as Jesus had said it would.
