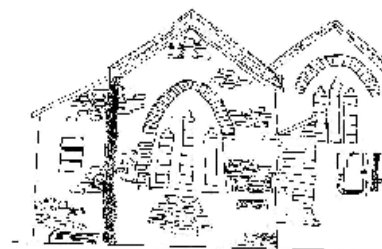

Dear Parents,

This week we were really excited to announce that Branscombe won the Sidmouth Rotary Club School Gardening Competition! We were awarded the 'Environmental Award'. The judges told us they were extremely impressed with the bat-friendly elements and how much the children could tell them about their hard work. Beau, Grace, Annabelle and Dillon were able to tell them lots of bat facts and guide them around the vegetables and herbs. It was clear to see the children were very proud of the work we have done in the garden this term.



On Wednesday, we were lucky enough to attend an award ceremony in Sidmouth. Beau and Annabelle were very excited and represented the school wonderfully. They collected the award, met the Sidmouth Rotary Club members, and had a celebration lunch. All of the children deserve a big WELL DONE for their efforts, they really paid off!

In Maths this week the children are working really hard at using their times tables knowledge of the 2s, 5s and 10s to help them with other problems. It is clear the children are benefiting from lots of counting practice! Our work on money is also going well, we are using lots of role play, and real life scenarios, in order for the children to use money in a realistic context - working out which coins/notes they need and how much change they will get!



Our literacy sequence on Flower Fairies has come to an end this week - the Key Stage 1 children have written poems based on their own chosen flower and have worked hard on rhyming patterns, and using exciting vocabulary. The rhythmic style of the Flower Fairy poems has helped all of the children to memorise them very well - our reception children have even been saying some of the poems in their entirety at home!

This week, Class 2 have begun rehearsing in earnest for their end-of-year play next week. They have also been busy preparing props and scenery for the play.

In Religious Education this week, the children continued this term's investigation into the key question, "Why are some journeys and places special?" The children learnt about Taize, a place in France that is visited by thousands of Christians each year. They then began to explore how this question is also applicable to different religions, learning more about the beliefs and practices of Hindus. Through watching videos and examining pictures, the children explored how Hindus worship in a mandir (temple) and then learned about places of Hindu pilgrimage, before comparing and contrasting the different ways that this question might be answered.

Make a 'hopes and dreams' catcher

Dream catchers are traditionally made from a looped willow branch onto which a net or web is woven. The net is then decorated with feathers, beads and other decorations. According to American Indian folklore, as we sleep, dreams are caught in the net and with the first rays of sunlight any bad dreams are burned away.

Find a long twig that can be bent and tied to make a hoop or frame. Use natural string or thread stretched across the frame to make the net and then decorate it creatively to catch all the **hopes** and dreams you can!
