

Scarlet Fever

We have been notified by Public Health Devon of a regional increase in cases of scarlet fever, above what would normally be expected at this time of year. Scarlet fever is usually a minor illness, but can occasionally cause complications and is contagious. For your information, signs and symptoms to watch out for include:

- Sore throat, headache, fever, nausea and vomiting.
- After 12-48 hours the characteristic red pinhead rash develops, typically first appearing on the chest and stomach and then spreading to other parts of the body and giving the skin a sandpaper-like texture.
- Patients typically have flushed cheeks and paleness around the mouth.

Good hand-washing is the key method to prevent spread of infection. Children and adults with suspected scarlet fever must be **excluded** from nursery/school/work for 24 hours after the commencement of appropriate antibiotics.
