Dear Parents,

We welcome Mrs Harvey to the school this week. In their topic work the children in Class 1, have been looking at the paintings of Claude Monet, in particular those of his garden. Inspired by his paintings they have painted watercolour pictures of the gardens that they explored at Bicton Park last Thursday. They very successfully had a go at imitating Monet's style.

The Little Explorers went on a plant hunt on Monday to gather some plants for the EYFS and KS1 children to study in their science lesson. The children named the parts of the plant and made observational drawings of them. They also discussed the various uses of plants, such as for food and medicine. The children also identified the ways in which we know that a plant is a living thing.

The children in Class 1 have continued to look at the story of 'The Tiny Seed' and have had a go at writing their own ideas for various disasters that could happen to the seeds. They have been using a story map to support them in their writing. In Maths, Class 1 have been identifying 2-D shapes in the school environment, and have discussed their properties and sorted them into shape families.

This week, the children in Class 2 have been publishing their written work about the Ancient Egyptian process of mummification, ready for display. They have been making their own model mummies out of tin foil and strips of kitchen paper. Once the mummy cases they have made have been painted and decorated with hieroglyphics in next week's Art lesson, they should be ready to create a spectacular classroom display about mummies and mummification! Meanwhile, the children have each chosen one aspect of life in Ancient Egypt to research in more detail, and write an explanation about - in the form of a set of instructions.

In their Maths work this week, the children have begun to review their knowledge of shapes and angles. Some of the older members of the class are also learning how to plot points and draw and move shapes on a coordinate grid. The year 6 children have been consolidating their understanding of drawing, positioning and translating the position of shapes on a grid divided into 4 quadrants and have begun to solve problems involving working out missing coordinates from what they already know.

Following their learning about the digestive system last week, this week Class 2 have focused more closely on teeth and eating, learning about (or revising) the functions and names of different teeth and also developing their knowledge of food groups and what constitutes a healthy diet. Later in the term, they will be learning more about the teeth and the diets of different animals.

At the end of last week, Class 2 enjoyed the opportunity to help prepare the school garden, weeding and digging over the soil ready for planting. They have since made a rota so that each week, three children from Class 2 will help to look after the garden, water the plants and remove the weeds. It would be helpful if, in the weeks when they are on gardening duty, the children can come to school suitably prepared with gardening clothes, coats and wellies.

Next week, on Thursday 10th May, which is Ascension Day, our Collective Worship will take the form of a school Eucharist service in St. Winifred's church. We welcome parents to join us in the church at 9.15am for this service if you are able. The focus of the service will of course be linked to Jesus' ascension into heaven following his death and resurrection.
