Class two ran very successful Fun Day stalls on Wednesday. They raised over £32 which was brilliant. As a class they have chosen to donate this money to the Devon Air Ambulance Trust in memory of Mr Ken Langton, our school neighbour, who sadly passed away during the summer holiday.

### Give Poverty the Boot Sponsored Walk

On Wednesday 20th October between 1 and 3pm the whole school will be doing a sponsored walk with Lucy from the National Trust. As part of our topic this term about 'ourselves' we have been talking about healthy eating and linking this to growing vegetables in the school allotment. We will also be talking to the children about how some countries find it more difficult to grow crops than we do. The sponsored walk will therefore be raising money for Farm Africa www.farmafrica.org.uk. Farm Africa provides the training and support that poor rural communities need to identify and implement appropriate solutions to many of the key problems they face. Families are directly supported to help work themselves out of poverty through improved ways to manage their crops, livestock, forests and access to water. The theme for our walk will be 'wellies' to link with their Give Poverty the Boot campaign! So over the coming weeks the children may be involved in some fun wellies activities! If you have any old wellies please don't throw them away they may be useful to your child or others over the next few weeks! During the walk Lucy will be showing the children autumn nuts and berries. The route will be similar to that of sponsored walks around Branscombe in previous year. Parents and friends of the school are welcome to join us on the day. In the mean time we would be really grateful if you could do your best to get sponsors for the walk. We have attached a sponsor form to this newsletter.

# Community Cohesion

Last term we asked for parents help with an audit we were carrying out into Community Cohesion, that is how the children are learning about and taking part in activities linked to their school and village community, Devon community, UK community and global community. Staff and governors were also asked to take part in the audit and we have now collated the results and drawn up an action plan. We are always looking to improve our links with the local community and so much thought has gone into that element of the action plan but the children's understanding of the UK Community was an area that we also feel needs addressing. Some of the ideas from the action plan are shown below. If you feel you can help in any way with the ideas mentioned please talk to a member of staff.

# School and local community level:

- Plan more activity action afternoons
- Widen the activities and responsibilities of the school council
- Make greater use of the school website to promote curriculum projects, linked to community cohesion
- Work with the Branscombe Project and local residents to produce an illustrated record of War Memories with local people

- Invite local residents to a Harvest Soup afternoon when children will serve soup they
  have made using local produce
- Have Christmas Play tickets available in Post Office to encourage villagers to attend
- Work closely with the new National Trust Community Warden to extend the range of opportunities for school and to develop the children's knowledge of local environment
- Make enquiries about pupils becoming 'Mill Guides' during the summer months
- Extend the range of visitors from the local and wider community (including faith representatives) to enrich children's learning

# Devon community level:

- Plan a topic about famous Devon County Customs, involve the National Trust where appropriate
- Make more use of Video Conferencing facilities to communicate with schools around Devon
- Plan a topic about charities when local, national and global charities are a focus
- Make a link to a Devon School in an urban area

# UK community level:

- Increase our library resources, visual aids and ICT material to more strongly reflect diversity in the UK
- Develop the curriculum (in particular the Arts and Historical, Geographical and Social Understanding) to greater reflect diversity in the UK
- Make more use of Video Conferencing facilities to communicate with schools around the UK
- Plan a topic about charities when local, national and global charities are a focus

### Global community level:

- Arrange a meeting with governors who have links in Kenya and Thailand to create a structured plan to develop the existing links with these two countries and with Ghana where our 'adopted' child lives
- Plan a topic about charities when local, national and global charities are a focus
