Dear Parents,

The year has got off to a super start in Class One, the children have settled in extremely well, getting stuck in to a wide variety of activities available to them.

Having listened to the story 'Giraffes Can't Dance', the children have learnt about 'Growth Mindset', thinking about those skills and talents that they already possess, as well as those things that they aren't as good at as they would like to be yet, but with a little more practice could improve in. They have made a beautiful display of their learning and thinking in our classroom that they would be pleased to talk to you about!

In R.E. they have been busy learning about Harvest and how celebrating at this time of year reminds Christians of all the good things that God has given to them. The children have learnt some Harvest songs including 'Cauliflowers Fluffy', and in their Art session have made representations of the fruit and vegetables included in the lyrics of this song, to display in the Village Hall.



They have also enjoyed working with fresh produce from our garden in Design and Technology; cutting lettuce, tomatoes and cucumbers to make a salad independently and taking responsibility for preparing a fruit salad for snack time.



The children have also made an excellent start with their first Literacy unit based on the traditional tale of 'The Little Red Hen'. Having learnt the narrative so that they can retell the story, the children have helped to write their own play script of 'The Little Red Hen' to perform at the Harvest Service. They are now in the midst of making corn, chickens and tractors to add to the class Working Wall. In Maths the children are concentrating on numbers, thinking about place value and explaining the difference between numbers such as 13 and 30.

Class One's first outdoor learning session of the year was a great success despite the weather! The children are looking forward to seeing the fruits of their labour, when the daffodils that they have planted, start to show themselves in the Spring Term.



Following several days of PSHE and settling activities last week, the children in Class Two have been settling into their normal weekly timetable this week. In Literacy, Class Two are using a series of videos of a Victorian lady's diary, to explore diary writing further, while also learning more about life in Victorian times.

In this week's History lesson, the children learned more about our current royal family, and looked back at the royal family tree to Queen Victoria. They used the Learnpads to research facts about Victoria and her nine children. They also began their work in the DEN (our role play area, where the children learn by Discussion, Exploring and Negotiating in groups) by reading about the life of a Victorian family, and attempting to make a timeline of the main events in the story. As the term goes on, they will have the opportunity to role play events or daily activities from the life of this family in the Victorian living room we have begun to set up in the DEN. If anyone has any Victorian objects (or replica artefacts) that they would consider lending the class to use in their role play or in their History lessons, these would be most gratefully received!

This week ended with a wonderful day of learning at Tiverton Museum, where the children, joined by the Key Stage 2 children from Farway, took part in a series of activities such as visiting a Victorian school, playing with Victorian children's toys and doing the laundry Victorian-style! They also had the opportunity to look around the museum to develop their knowledge - and hopefully their curiosity - about familiar objects from the Victorian period, such as a penny-farthing bicycle.

In our Collective Worship this week, the children were preparing their contributions for this weekend's Harvest Service at St. Winifred's Church. They also began to focus on this term's theme "Forgiveness" by exploring the story of the Lost Son (also known as the 'Prodigal Son') from Luke 15 and discussing Rembrandt's famous work of art, "The Return of the Prodigal Son". The children used their "rabbit-like" learning skills of empathy and listening to talk with a partner about how the son, his father and the older brother would have felt at different parts of the story, and how we can sometimes find ourselves in each of those roles: needing to forgive others, needing to seek forgiveness or sometimes, like the elder brother in the story, feeling resentful when other people receive forgiveness when we feel they don't deserve it!
