Dear Parents,

This week we have had a number of visitors to the school, including Jay's Grandma, the National Trust, and ChildLine.

Jay's Grandma came on Thursday to talk to Class 1 about her experiences as a child, and the children were able to ask her lots of questions about how things were different when she was their age. They were very interested in her answers and found several very surprising, particularly when they found out that most people did not have a telephone in their house, and that there would have been a telephone box at the end of the street for all the houses to share. They were also told that most houses did not have an indoor bathroom, which stimulated much discussion about what it would be like to have to go outside to use the toilet, particularly at this time of year.

Today the National Trust came and did their monthly session with both classes. This time Helen Parr from the *Greater Horseshoe Bat Project* ran part of the session indoors, and the children went outside to plant hedges at Manor Mill Farm for the other part. These sessions are proving to be very positive. The sessions are providing the children with valuable experiences as well as good learning opportunities and they seem to be getting a lot out of the sessions.

ChildLine came on Monday for their Safeguarding assembly with Year 5 and 6 children. The session was very successful and the children seemed to respond well and take the information on board. ChildLine will be returning next week for a follow-up workshop with the same children.

Looking forward to next week, Tuesday is *Safer Internet Day* when both classes will be discussing how they can stay safe while using the internet, and on Wednesday Class 2 will be visiting the Church with Revd. Hilary Dawson to look at symbols of faith.
