

Dear Parents

This week, Class 2, together with the children in Year 2, have been busy preparing for our Leavers' play, "Greece! The Musical" which we will be performing at 1.30pm on Monday 18th July in Branoc Hall. The performance will be followed by our annual prize-giving and a farewell for the Year 6 children (please see the further note below regarding arrangements following the play). We will continue this farewell on Thursday 20th July, when we will be meeting for a special Leavers' Service in St. Winifred's Church, from 9.15 - 9.45 am. You are all welcome to join us for either or both of these events.



Thank you to those who came to support the children on Wednesday afternoon for our special sharing assembly, in which the children demonstrated what they have learned in their clarinet lessons this term. They played three pieces of music, first playing the separate parts and then putting the parts together to form an ensemble. Their teacher, Mrs Palmer, also demonstrated the difference in sound between the clarinets the children have been playing and her own bass clarinet. In next term's Music lessons, we will be building on what the children have learned about reading music, transferring this across to learning to play the recorder.

Class 2 have also been busy in our Art lessons, learning to make coil pots

with clay. We shall be using some of these as props in our play and painting the others next week with Olympic designs -Ancient Greek style!

Thank you to all those parents and pupils who attended our open evening this week. I hope you enjoyed looking at the inspiring classroom displays and the children's books which demonstrate what a varied range of activities and learning

experiences the pupils have enjoyed this year. I would like to say a personal thank you to all the staff and volunteers who have worked so hard this year to ensure that the children cover the curriculum, and enjoy extra curricular activities, in such fun ways – a big well done to them all!

Our gardening club were very successful this week, with our allotment and planting areas being highly commended by the judges in the Sidmouth Rotary Schools Garden competition, and winning a shield for "Most Environmentally Sustainable Garden". Nicola and Candice have

worked very hard with the children on the sustainability of the garden this year, recycling materials wherever possible, for example with our mint garden in a sink, our pallet and pillowcase herb planter, and by using the tyres as potato planters. They have used organic slug pellets made from sheep's wool, and the judges also admired our African garden. Well done to all the children who have taken part in gardening club this year. Two of our star gardeners, Ismay and Reggie went with Candice to collect the award and were brilliant ambassadors for our school, showing their excellent manners by thanking all of the rotary members in turn. Thank you to all the parents who have contributed materials and plants, and thank you also to Nicola and Candice who have worked so hard this year to keep the garden ticking over.
