

Dear Parents,

This week our children have had their monthly outdoor learning session with the National Trust team, this time working down by the stream.

Class 1 did an investigation to find out whether different materials would float or sink, before making their own miniature rafts. They each chose some sticks to make the raft with and decided how to tie them together for best

> effect. They then chose different items collected from

the orchard to decorate their raft. When they were finished, Mr Ford put each raft in the stream while the children watched to see if they would float under the bridge.

Class 2's session brought together several strands of their recent classwork, including Geography work on rivers, Science work on

First, they visited the stream by the village hall. They considered the factors that might affect

what lives in the stream and did some stream-dipping. Using a classification key they identified some of the creatures they found, such as water crickets, mayfly nymphs, shrimps and water worms. Some of the children also measured the depth and flow rate of the stream, taking several measurements and finding the average. The class then went on a "River and Stream" scavenger hunt, looking for features such as a meander, ford, tributary or confluence, as well as observing different ways in which the water is used by people. They observed that the water flows faster on the

inside of a bend and tends to erode the bank


outside of a bend and tends to deposit sand and rocks there. They had a lot of fun whilst also developing their vocabulary and understanding.
