


Dear Parents,

It was great to see so many children and families at the Summer Fair on Saturday. It was a really super event with lots of things to do for all age groups. Children and parents made the most of the sunshine with plenty of refreshing drinks, scrumptious cakes, splatting the rat and several good sports brave enough to have wet sponges thrown in their faces! We are very pleased that the grand total raised for this year was £ 1,029.94. A big thank you must go to all the members of the PTFA who have given up so much of their own time to organise and plan the event. A big sunny thank you to all our sponsors and supporters – we couldn't have done it without you.

The families at Broadhembury have been trialing a new reading resource over the last half term. The resource is called 'Bug Club' and is produced by Pearson Education. Each child receives a password and is able to log on at home to a selection of e-reading books chosen for them by their class teachers. The resource has proved really popular at our partner school and children who, in the past, have not been keen readers are now really enthusiastic about daily practice. The e-books also include short quizzes and tasks about the books and the children are able to collect rewards throughout the books.

I am pleased to inform you that this week the governing body approved the purchase of the Bug Club licence for both schools. We will also be purchasing real books of the same titles so that the children will also be able to borrow these from the library. Children who do not have access to a computer at home will be able to spend time at school using the e-books. Further details will be sent home in September. As a staff we have been having a focus on reading throughout this last academic year and the progress the children have made within this area of the curriculum has been very pleasing. We hope that this extra resource will further encourage children to read.

You should be receiving your child's annual report with this newsletter today. Inside the envelope there is a feedback form for you to tell us your thoughts about your child's year at school and the style of report. There will also be an opportunity for you to talk to your child's class teacher about the content of the report during the open day on Wednesday.

Children from Years 2 and 6 will also receive their SATS results today. We are delighted with the results the children have gained this year. 83% of Year 6 pupils gained Level 5 for Reading (national expectation is level 4). In Mathematics 100% of pupils gained Level 4 or above, with 83% gaining Level 5. In the new Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling test 83% gained Level 4 or above with 50% gaining Level 5. Well done to all the pupils in Year 6, you have made us very proud!
