

Dear Parents,

This week, Class 1 enjoyed their second visit to the orchard to learn more about habitats and to think about the food chains that form part of life for the creatures living here. The children began their session by playing lots of games; they helped them to think about the difference between mammals, birds, reptiles, minibeasts and amphibians, as well as the difference between predators and their prey! During the morning they had the opportunity to check on their bug hotels to see if they had attracted any visitors; they also played the roles of a variety of animals,

positioning themselves in the food chains that they would expect to find them in. Finally they made some hedgehog hibernation houses, filling

them with a bed of straw and a blanket of dried leaves. The children are hoping that they make a cosy home for some spiked friends in the coming winter months.

In Class two the week began with a very active day on Monday. After their athletics lesson in the morning with PE coach Richard Ralph, the children of Class 2 had an afternoon of outside learning with the National Trust. Having set out




from school in beautiful sunshine just minutes before, the afternoon activities were delayed when the class was caught in a sudden downpour of rain. Thankfully the rain soon passed and the fun began. Continuing the theme of 'Invaders and Settlers', the first activity was a 'Romans and Celts' invasion wide game, in which the children had to consider their team strategy to avoid being captured by the 'enemy'! Next, the battle having temporarily ceased, the children



considered the different job roles that would be needed in building their new settlement and the equipment that they might find most useful.

On Tuesday afternoon, Class 2 rounded up our work on the Roman invasion in Britain by considering the lasting legacy that was left by the Romans in our country - from language to straight roads to concrete to apples and pears to pet cats... and much more besides. Wednesday was a busy day, getting ready for our Roman day at Farway on Thursday. The children prepared a range of Roman recipes: stuffed 'dormice' (pastry mice stuffed with sausage filling), spiced chicken legs, ricotta and honey tarts and stuffed dates. While the cooks were busy, the craftspeople were making half a dozen Roman shields to be used in practising army drills on Thursday.

Thursday saw much fun and games as our "Roman" topic drew to a close with the federation coming together for the Roman Road-show and a magnificent Roman feast. It was a fantastic experience. In the morning we were visited by experts from the Royal Albert Memorial Museum who led activities associated with the Seaton Down Horde, discovered locally. The children talked to a Roman who was here two thousand years ago, did archaeological digging, handled artefacts and made Roman coins. After a fantastic



Redding from Broadhembury; and practising army drills, including tortoise formation, with Mr Smith from Farway. Great fun was had by all, and the children cannot wait for the next Federation event.

Thank you very much for the support of you parents for kitting out our young Romans so spectacularly and for the fantastic shields that they came armed with; I think they all learnt a lot from the experience and will remember the day for quite some time.

After half term, Class 2 will continue to learn about Invaders and Settlers - this time, the Anglo-Saxons.

Next week is Half term, myself and the staff team all wish you a lovely break and will see you back at school on **Tuesday 1st November**; nice and refreshed. On Friday 4th November the children from Farway School will be joining us for an exciting sporting event.
