Dear Parents

A massive well done to all the children that took part in the Exe Valley Challenge at the weekend. You should be very proud of yourselves — and you looked super in your yellow t-shirts! A big thank you to all the staff and parents who gave up their Sunday to support this event.



On Wednesday 6th July, Class Two worked outdoors with the National Trust, completing a range of activities to support our Science work this term on the topic of sound and hearing. First, they listened quietly and recorded some of the sounds they could hear, trying to identify what was making those sounds. They discussed how sounds are made and used bamboo to make a set of panpipes with different pitched notes. They noticed that the longer sticks made lower sounds. Finally, the children discussed how sound can travel through solids and liquids as well as through gases (like air). They experimented with moving further and further apart to see how far the sound of our speaking voices would travel.





Later the children used paper cups to make a string telephone and noticed how the sound of their voices travelled further along a taut piece of string than it did through the air.

To support this term's Science investigations involving water, floating and sinking, Class One worked with the National Trust and used natural materials to build model rafts.

They began by looking at a range of materials and investigating which ones would float. Then the children built their own rafts out of materials such as sticks, string and cardboard. They had to consider how to attach the materials together and how to waterproof their rafts. The rafts were tested to see if they would hold a cargo of a boiled egg and keep it out of the water!



Also this week Class 1 have been investigating the properties of a variety of liquids using Litmus paper to find out whether they were acid, neutral or alkali. First the children noted their predictions before putting a drop of the solution being tested into small pots. Then they dipped the indicator into the liquid and observed the change in colour. They needed to know what colour the Litmus paper would change to with an acid, alkali or neutral. They recorded their results in a table. The children found out that some acids like lemon juice and vinegar taste sour and that water is a neutral, which means that it is neither an acid or an alkali.

Class Two has been a little smaller for much of this week as most of our Year 6 have been enjoying their transition days at Sidmouth College. From the reports that have trickled back so far, it sounds like they have been having a great time! The rest of the class have been busy while they have been away and especially enjoyed welcoming Year 2 on Monday afternoon for another

transition visit, in which they were learning a little more about the plans for the Rio Olympics '16 and comparing the ancient and modern Olympics.
