Dear Parents,

After an all too brief visit to the Branscombe Summer Fair on Saturday I left the village, taking great care of the coconut my son was so proud to have won, and drove to Exeter to meet the children from across The Jubilee Federation (including our new school Farway) for the Installation of the new Bishop of Exeter.

The children, with their banners, joined the Barnstaple Youth Marching Band, pupils from two other schools and representatives from the Young Farmers' Association to start the procession down the High Street. Once at the Cathedral doors we walked through the Young Farmers' Guard of Honour made from 'pitch forks' to enter the building.



During the service I had a seat near to the High Altar with a fantastic view of the ceremonial parts of the service. There were some very formal moments such as when the Chancellor of the Diocese read the Mandate from the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, some beautiful music and prayers of intercession read by people representing several sections of Devon life e.g. a Member of Parliament, a Headteacher and a Chaplain of a local charity.

A particularly moving element was when the previous Bishop of Exeter, Michael Langrish, took the pastoral staff from the High Altar, where he had left it on the day of his retirement a year ago. He walked to the Bishop's throne and presented it to the new Bishop, Robert Atwell, saying 'receive this staff, the symbol of pastoral care and succession'.

I feel very privileged as a Church School Headteacher to have been given the opportunity to attend this service and I would like to say a big thank you to those families from across The Federation who came to join me for the procession. I will conclude by sharing with you the blessing that was used in the service – the blessing of Leofric, first Bishop of Exeter.

May the Lord grant you understanding of his wisdom and his grace, and make you diligent in his service.

May he nourish you in the riches of his Gospel and make you persevere in all good works.

May he keep your steps from wandering and direct you in paths of love and peace.

Please make sure all school library books are returned to school by **Wed 16**th **July.** Thank you.

School Meals from September

As of September the Government are funding free school meals for all children in Reception, year 1 and year 2. Despite this change in funding, the system for ordering school meals will remain the same. If you would like your child to receive a school meal, you must place an order by **9am on the Monday morning of that week** (except for exceptional circumstances). Forms are available in the entrance hall (please notify the office if more are required), and must be filled out for each child and placed in the box labelled "money and notes for the office". If you would like to order meals for several weeks or even the whole term in advance, simply fill out a form for each week you are ordering for, making sure you include the correct date on each form.

Parents of children in Pre-school and in years 3-6 will need to continue to pay for their children's school meals in advance. In accordance with our policy, payments for school meals should be made by **9am of the Monday before the meals are taken** and if a debt of more than £20 is accrued the parent will be asked for immediate payment of outstanding debt before further meals are ordered.

Waste Free Lunch day
