Dear Parents,

In Class 1 this week the children have been thinking about money in their Maths lessons; they have used their skills in addition and subtraction to solve word problems and find the necessary change when paying for items. The children have also enjoyed getting to grips with our new book *Lord of the Forest* in our English sessions. They have thought about how the tiger is the 'king of the jungle', writing stories about what they imagine him to behave like and the things that he does. They have worked hard to learn about the different types of sentences and the use of narrative as well as dialogue within a story. In Science, they have been learning about the food chains of some of the minibeasts and insects whose habitat is our school field, whilst in PSHE we have been talking about our responsibilities towards each other and being kind and thoughtful.



Teamwork has been a particular focus in the activities in Class 2 this week. The class began the week by thinking about how to support, protect and be kind to their classmates. After a practice in their PE lesson on Monday, the children joined the Key Stage 2 children from across the Federation to take part in a handball tournament at Honiton Community College. The children from the Jubilee Federation were divided into three teams and each team played several matches against teams from other schools in the Honiton Learning Community. The children all played with great energy and commitment, even when playing

against teams of older children. Thank you children for doing your school and the federation proud.

Class 2 have also worked in teams to learn and recite sections of their new core text in Literacy; to prepare and present dramatic scenarios of courageous service in Class Collective Worship; to solve mathematical problems and to plan and conduct experiments in Science. The children have also prepared patterned designs in preparation for next week, when a visiting mosaic artist will help them to use tiles to make their own tiled pan-stands.

Please may I remind parents that you should not drive up the lane to drop your children off at the school gate. For safety reasons, please park at the bottom of the lane and walk your children up to school. This week there was a near miss between a

### **Free School Meals**

From September 2014, all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 in state-funded schools in England are eligible for free school meals.
