

Dear Parents,

Class 1 have had a busy week using the gardening topic to inspire their literacy writing. On Monday, they followed a set of instructions to create an 'Egg Cress Head'. They had to read the instructions carefully - bossy verbs told the children what to do, time connectives told them when to do something, and adverbs told them how. The children learnt that in order for the cress to grow, the head needs to be in a damp, warm environment - they have been growing quickly already, the class think they look rather good!



We were very lucky this week, as Helen visited us from the Devon Greater Horseshoe Bat Project. The children learnt all about the different species of bat in our local area and were surprised to know there are lots of pregnant Mummy bats roosting in a barn very close to Branscombe! Helen introduced us to the Bat Buddy School Award which we can complete by tasks to help protect the bats. Unfortunately Mrs Harvey is poorly at the moment. We are pleased to say that Miss Watts has been able to cover the majority of her absence ensuring continuity for the children. We look forward to Mrs Harvey coming back to Branscombe very shortly.

This week, the children in Class 2 went to Egypt - using 'Google Earth'! The children drew maps showing the location of some of Egypt's significant features and historical locations, and began to find out more about the country. They have also been developing their understanding of Ancient Egypt by learning the songs from their forthcoming summer production, 'A Glint of Gold'.

In their RE lesson last week, the children learnt about the 'Five Marks of Mission' of the Church of England. This week, they learned more about the biblical character of Saul, who became known as Paul. The children read stories about Paul in the book of Acts and identified some of the five marks of mission in these stories, discovering more about what 'mission' means to Christians and what a missionary is. They looked at maps of Paul's missionary journeys. Next, the children will be learning more about other Christian missionaries and exploring their biographies to discover how they showed the 'Five Marks of Mission' in their lives. This will link with the children's current work in Literacy, in which they have begun to explore the features of an effective biography text. The core text they are using for this Literacy sequence of work is '50 Women in Science', which explores the lives, achievements and challenges faced by 50 women who have made significant contributions in a wide range of scientific and technological fields.

At the end of the week, Class 2 joined other children from across the Federation for their practice walk for the Exe Valley Challenge on 1st July, in which many of the Branscombe Class 2 children will be taking part. This event, which takes place in Exeter, beginning at Isca College, is a challenge in which the children walk along the river and canal paths from Isca College into the quayside at Exeter, out to Countess Wear and back to Isca via the crematorium. This week, the children walked part of this route so that they could become more familiar with the area and the route, as well as considering how they could take care of their own safety and that of their group members while walking together in teams for the event
