

School Funding

As we all could anticipate the coalition government are making huge changes to the way schools are funded. The full details of which are yet to be finalised but we do know that a large proportion of our budget will be based around the number of parents who claim Free School Meals. To benefit from this, 17% of our parents need to be claiming for Free School Meals. Our figure at the moment is approximately half of this. We feel that the problem with this method of assessing the need for funding, is that some children who may be eligible for free school meals prefer to bring a packed lunch and therefore do not claim. If you are in receipt of any of the following benefits please, please speak in confidence to Mrs Gray or Nicola so that we can help you to process your claim. Your child doesn't then need to actually order the free meal but it will help hugely with our school funding.

You are entitled to free school meals if you receive any of the following: Income Support (IS) Employment Support Allowance (Income Related) Child Tax Credit without Working Tax Credit with an annual taxable income (as assessed by HMR&C) of less than £16,190 Income-based Job Seekers Allowance (IBJSA) Guaranteed Element of State Pension Credit Support under Part VI of the Immigration & Asylum Act 1999

Milk

We have been given an opportunity to take part in a subsidised school milk scheme. If you choose to take part you sign up directly with the scheme and then milk is delivered to school for your child. Leaflets will be sent home with all children but if you have any further questions please ask Nicola.
