Dear Parents,

It's been a super last week of term. In connection with the anniversary of WW1, Class 2 have made a detailed investigation of the Branscombe War Memorial. We have made sketches and rubbings. Some of the children have even carried out calculations to estimate its weight! Research into the names of soldiers who died in the war have shown that they used to live in houses that some of the children in the class currently live in. Most of our information has been gleaned from the commonwealth war graves commission website and the website of the Branscombe Project. As a result of our research we have produced a collection of poetry which will be displayed at the Village Hall during the Branscombe Project Exhibition between 10<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup> April, 12pm – 5pm. The poems will also be entered into an East Devon District Council competition relating to the War Memorials near to local primary schools.

The children had their last gymnastics lesson with the Broadhembury pupils yesterday. It was great to see so many parents joining us for the performances. I hope you enjoyed watching the children. The progress they have made over the 6 weeks has been excellent.

Every child also visited the Life Education Caravan yesterday – I hope they've told you about some of the things they learnt about and that those of you who managed to attend the parent workshop felt it was a valuable resource.

This morning the whole school was entertained by Class 2 who have been having percussion sessions this term. They performed brilliantly and it was lovely to see that they were clearly enjoying themselves as they played.
