Dear Parents,

This week has been another busy week in school. On Tuesday, as part of Safer Internet Day the children took part in a number of activities designed to give them an awareness of how to remain safe when using the internet. Class 2 tackled subjects such as stranger-danger, cyber bullying, age appropriate images/videos, virus protection and advertising. Class 1 learned key things to remember when using the internet, such as not sharing personal information and making sure they tell a trusted adult if they go online. They also learned a useful slogan: "Think think think, don't click click click", designed to make them aware of the dangers of following links that may appear whilst they are online. Particularly for Class 1, learning how to be safe on the internet will have to be an ongoing process as the children get older and start to use the internet more often. If you have any questions regarding what the children covered, or would like to discuss anything relating to internet safety with the staff, please do make an appointment to speak to your child's teacher. It is important that schools and parents can work together on this important issue.

Yesterday Class 1 went to the village hall for a Capoeira performance by Class 2. There were several parents in the audience too which was lovely. Capoeira is a type of South American street dance which Class 2 have been learning in their PE sessions this term. It is quite technical and difficult to master, but the children showed how just how hard they have been working and performed very well.

Class 1 really enjoyed the performance, and I hope the parents did too. Well done to all the children involved.
