Dear Parents,

Last week we had a very special visit from The Archdeacon of Exeter, The Venerable Christopher Futcher. He joined us for our school Eucharist and presented the school Ethos Team with our 'outstanding' SIAMS inspection certificate which is now in the entrance hall at school. The Ethos Team from Broadhembury also came to the service, as did the new vicar of Broadhembury. We are going to start having Eucharist services at Broadhembury too and so they were coming to experience the liturgy we use at Branscombe.



This week, Class 1 have been investigating the question, 'How do we know that dinosaurs actually existed?' The children learnt that a fossil is the remains of an animal that once lived on earth. They listened to the story 'Stone Girl, Bone Girl', and talked about what Mary discovered and why this discovery was so exciting.

Using the iPads, FizzBooks and information books, the children were asked to carry out further research about Mary Anning, to be able to create a fact file. First, they selected the facts that interested them, and then they chose how they wished to record these. They were given an image of Mary Anning, underneath which the children wrote an explanation of her work, explaining why she was famous, and about some of the fossils that she found. More advanced members of the class were then asked to write a diary entry, as if they were Mary, to record what they have found.

In Science lessons this week, the children have been combining their learning from multiple subjects, to gather and present their findings, following several scientific investigations. Having been on material hunts around the school, where the class were asked to think about what different materials feel like, look like and can be used for, the children collected some of their favourites and what they considered to be most interesting.

They then tested them, to learn more about the benefit of materials that are transparent, opaque, particularly strong or flexible. Using their Mathematics skills they sorted the data that they collected, into Venn Diagrams and Bar Charts. They then used their writing skills, to present their thoughts on the suitability of a particular material, for a purpose of their choice.

This week the children in Class 2 have been researching and writing reports about different aspects of Space. Some have found out more about the Sun, Moon or one of the planets, while others have researched the International Space Station or other space phenomena such as nebulae. Having written their reports, the children worked with a peer partner to proof-read and

edit their writing, before redrafting and publishing for display. The space to watch for these is just inside the classroom door!

The week ended for Class 2 with a space-themed workshop in the village hall, together with the Key Stage 2 children from across the Jubilee Federation. They were visited by a space dome and also found out more about the history of space exploration, completed craft activities around the constellations and then worked collaboratively in teams to collect resources they might need for a space mission, in a specially designed game.

Also, Class 2 have been working hard to learn the songs that some of them will be performing, along with children from other local schools, at the Sidmouth Learning Community Music Festival next Thursday.

Next Tuesday, we will be completing a range of activities to mark "Safer Internet Day 2018". This year's theme is "Create, Connect and Share Respect: a better Internet starts with you." This is a great opportunity to link the work the children are doing in school with the way they use the Internet at home, so we would encourage you to take the opportunity to talk to your child about the rules and guidelines that will help to keep them safe online and also make the Internet a safer place for others.
