
Over the Half Term holiday Jay and Freya joined me at The Bath and West Show to receive our Environmental Youth Award. This innovative and exciting regional competition was started in 1996 by Brigadier John Hemsley with the Royal Bath & West of England Society and has now become firmly established, capitalising upon its success in encouraging many youngsters to become interested in environmental and conservation matters.

The aim of the Environmental Youth Award is to promote a greater awareness and understanding of conservation and environmental matters by encouraging and recognising the contribution made by young people. This recognition is promoted via an award made to a group of young people who have made a significant contribution to conservation and/or environmental management and applies equally to either an urban or rural environment. The award scheme is open to formal as well as ad hoc youth groups from the six counties of Bristol, Dorset, Somerset,

East Devon, South Gloucestershire and Wiltshire. One nomination each year is selected from each of the counties covered by the Society. Bearing in mind the main objective of fostering and encouraging interest in environmental matters, the selections are made on the basis of rewarding originality and effort, irrespective of age, provided this is within an overall quality project.

The six county nominations are assessed by a panel of judges who decide upon a Regional winner. We received a lovely Bronze Hedgehog trophy, a generous cheque and a certificate.

The children have made a good first week back following the



In Maths we have been busy collecting data by asking questions such as 'What is your favourite flower?' The children have presented the data collected in the form of block graphs and pictograms. They have interpreted the data and written sentences to show what the data tells us, for example 'Roses are more popular than Buttercups'.

In our topic work, we have been comparing a local forest (Haldon Forest) with a rainforest in Borneo. We have looked at what trees and plants you can find growing in Haldon Forest, compared to those growing in the rainforest in Borneo. We have talked about the different climates and what animals you might find living in the different forests. The children particularly enjoyed looking at the photographs of the Orang-utans. We are continuing to observe how our lettuce seedlings are growing.

In Class 2 this week, the children have begun a new Maths topic, in which they will be consolidating and developing their use of a range of mental and written strategies for addition and subtraction and applying these to solve problems in a range of contexts. The children discussed the different ways in which numerical data can be explored and presented in charts



and graphs and began to consider which would be the best way of presenting particular sets of data. Over the next few weeks, they will develop their understanding by carrying out a range of investigations, presenting the results of these in graphs and charts, and explaining what the graphs and charts reveal about the results of their investigations.

On Wednesday, the children in Class 2 were able to learn a lot more about the different Egyptian gods by sharing with one another the homework they had completed over the half-term period, when they were asked to research one particular god and present their findings in a leaflet or poster. Their posters and leaflets will soon be displayed in the class "museum", which the children are developing in their 'DEN'. The 'DEN' is an area in the computer room, where the children spend time working independently and collaboratively, in groups to learn more about topics by Discussing, Exploring and Negotiating (DEN), as well as applying their reading, research and writing skills. This term, the children are working to turn the DEN area into an Egyptian museum display. It is hoped that next week's visit to the Royal Albert Memorial museum will further inspire this ongoing project.
