Walk to School Reward Scheme

Now that we have our lovely new path and as part of our school's commitment to encouraging healthy activity amongst our pupils (and parents) we are Walking the Wizard Way!

What is it?

Walking the Wizard Way is a Devon County Council scheme where children are rewarded for walking to school.

How does it work?

- * Children walk to school at least the length of the school path or further
- * Children earn certificates by collecting signatures in their 'Wizard' tally cards every time they walk to school.


Why Walk the Wizard Way?

- * It promotes healthy exercise and helps keep children (and adults) fit.
- * It can help children to develop personal and road safety skills.
- * It can reduce traffic outside the school.
- * It gives children the chance to learn more about their local environment.

What else do I need to know?

Walking the Wizard Way requires commitment and honesty from parents and children involved. Parents need to complete the cards in the evening after school and keep track of the awards. This simply involves signing or ticking your child's card for every walk they do (one signature for walking to school and another for walking home). Wizard tally cards and certificates are provided free by Devon County Council through our school. The children have all received a start up pack today and we will monitor their cards to see when certificates are needed.

Some of you may be aware that we recently had a full Ofsted Inspection. I am delighted to tell you that this inspection went very well indeed, largely due to the fantastic work put in by all the committee especially Tracey and Catharine. The impact of this enthusiasm and wonderful teamwork is evident in the inspector's comments below:

"The quality of teaching and learning is good. Children participate enthusiastically in the activities on offer. They are very chatty and bubbly, and confident to share what they know..... Staff support and extend the children's vocabulary and mathematical development very well..... Staff make good use of questions to challenge the children's thought processes and encourage them to think things through for themselves Children engage in a range of interesting activities to stimulate their interest and curiosity....... and enjoy the many craft activities. Staff plan well to support the children's progress. New systems in place effectively link to the six areas of learning and the steps within...... Children are well behaved. Staff are positive and provide children clear and consistent messages about considering the needs of others and being polite...... Leadership and management of the care and nursery education is good. Children's care and learning needs are supported well due to the high ratios of well – qualified and enthusiastic staff. The staff team feel valued and supported in their role.... They work well together as a team, effectively communicating to share tasks and responsibilities to support each other, parents and the children.

The Preschool Committee would like to thank Tracey and Catharine for all their hard work since the beginning of term. A full copy of the report is available in the preschool for anyone to read. We also recognise parents as the first and most important educators of their children and we are grateful to you for working in partnership with the preschool staff to ensure your child/children enjoy and benefit from the activities they participate in.
