

Dear Parents,

Pupils in Class 1 have been working exceptionally hard this week, making a fantastic start on new units of work in English, Mathematics, Science and History. In English they have begun studying 'The Rainbow Fish' and have participated in Drama activities to improve their familiarity with the story. The children have been thinking carefully about the interesting vocabulary that they have met and finding synonyms for a variety of adverbs and adjectives using the thesaurus. In 'spelling, punctuation and grammar' lessons, they have been learning about how to use inverted commas correctly to demarcate the dialogue in their writing. Within their Mathematics lessons they have been learning about multiplication and division, as well as fractions of numbers. They have been concentrating on halves, quartering and thirds and have thought about the language/symbols associated with these skills, such as doubled, twice as much as and divided by. Science and History was all mixed up together when the children found out about the adventures of Charles Darwin who went sailing on his ship 'The Beagle', and the discoveries that he made on the Galapagos Islands. The children learnt about adaptation and made their very own notebooks, like that of Darwin himself, to document their learning about creatures such as komodo dragons, lava lizards and giant turtles!

Class 2 have also had a busy week and they began their swimming lessons at Sidmouth pool on Tuesday. They began their new focus on the heroes of Ancient Greece by using maps and pictures to learn a little more about the geography of Greece and beginning to make a timeline of some of the major events in Ancient Greece. In Literacy, they have begun a sequence of work in which they shall be reading some Greek myths and legends and writing them in the form of play scripts. They have also made a start on preparations for our end-of-year play, which will be linked to the topic of Ancient Greece, featuring characters such as Zeus, Hera, Hermes, Icarus and Prometheus.
