

Dear Parents,

As you know last week Class 2 had a poetry party, where they worked as groups to rehearse and present some "performance" poems, using sound effects and actions. They also then

each recited a poem they had learned by heart. The children really enjoyed their afternoon, as you can see from the picture!

This week Class 2 have had a very successful art lesson looking at the botanical drawings of Beatrix Potter and then having a go at emulating her





techniques in their sketchbooks. They made some careful observational sketches and added some colour with watercolour paints.

Both classes had a session with the National Trust on Wednesday this week. Class 1 learned about how fire burns, and what is needed to make a fire. They collected things that

they thought would burn on a fire and learned these had to be dry. Some of

the children had a go at lighting a fire using a flint and steel. When the fire was lit, they very much enjoyed using it to toast some marshmallows.

Class 2 looked at the different types of land use in Branscombe and learned a little more about the land owned by the National Trust and how it came to be owned and managed by them. The children coloured maps to show the areas used for agricultural, recreational, institutional,





residential and commercial purposes. They also built a bug hotel in Monterey copse, linking in with their recent science work on habitats.
