

School Play

The rescheduled School 'Christmas' Play will now take place on Monday 24th January. There will be a dress rehearsal in the afternoon at 1.15pm. Parents are welcome to bring small children to this performance. The actual performance will be held at 6pm the same evening.

Swimming

Wassailing

The Wassailing event will take place on Saturday 15th January. The children have composed a song and completed art work for the event which will start at 6pm. Please park in the Village Hall car park and meet at the National Trust Visitors Centre. Please wear warm clothes and suitable footwear. Bring a torch and something to bang – such as a wooden spoon and pan lid. The cost is £3 per adult and £2 per child. From 12 noon until 4pm the same day there will be a lantern making workshop in the Village Hall. Please bring a mincepie foil case or something similar or a small torch. All other materials will be provided. The cost is £3 per child. Adults are free.

School Dinners

The new school dinner menus were sent home earlier this week. Please could all dinners be ordered and paid for at the beginning of each week, or for the whole half term. Thank you.

Sickness Absence

If your child is absent from school we need you to write a letter or complete a form (available in the leaflet tray in foyer or from the office) explaining why they have been absent. This allows us to correctly identify the type of absence on their attendance records. If these are not completed their attendance will be recorded as unauthorised absence. As there were a number of children off in the last couple of weeks of last term we have sent forms home with those children whose parents need to complete them - please return them to the office at the beginning of next week.

Flu Advice

We have been reminded of the need for high standards of personal hygiene to prevent the spread of flu. Influenza is most infectious when symptoms start until about 3-5 days later. There are no recommended times of exclusion from school for an infected child: a child should return once they are well enough. Department of Health advice is that children who have a fever and are exhibiting flu like symptoms should be kept off school until the fever has subsided; this can take between 2 and 7 days.

Meningitis Day

As many of you will know a few years ago Pete Lovell, Nicole's father contracted meningitis. On 21st January we are going to hold a 'yellow day' to raise money for The Meningitis Trust. Children can come dressed in yellow if they bring in a donation for the charity. We also hope to raise awareness of this awful illness, especially as this is the most common time of the year when people contract meningitis. We also hope to have a very special visitor in school - Monty the Duck!

Plastic Bottles

Class 2 will be making something very exciting linked to their topic of 'Recycling' this term! If you have any 1 litre or 2 litre plastic bottles please could you send them into school - we need lots!

Battery Recycling

There is now a box in the entrance hall for battery recycling. If you have any types of batteries including things like mobile phone and laptop batteries please bring them into school.
