BRANSCOMBE WAVES

A couple of years ago the School Council worked with the whole school to devise some children's school aims which they chose to call The Branscombe Waves. We have been talking in assembly about these and I asked the children to draw me some pictures showing the sort of behaviour described in the aims.

The Figure of Eight Team were asked to illustrate 'Be Hard Workers and do Our Best'

The Clove Hitch Team were asked to illustrate 'Be Kind, Caring and Loving'

The Reef Knot Team were asked to illustrate 'Be Friendly Have Fun and Play Together Well'

Children were asked if they wanted to do an extra picture they could illustrate 'Be Respectful'.

PLAYTIME SNACKS

As part of our Healthy School status the only Playtime Snacks that we permit in school are muesli bars and fruit. We have noticed recently that a large proportion of children are eating crackers, biscuits, crisps etc at playtime. We would ask that parents support us in our aim to encourage the children to eat fruit for their snacks.

PARKING

We have been asked by the PCC to remind parents that the Church Parking Spaces should not be used by parents at the beginning and end of the school day. Please could you ensure that cars are parked at the Village Hall and the school footpath is used.

The school fair will be held on Sunday 5th July and will coincide with the Branscombe 5-aside Football Tournament. **Please could you collect bric-a-brac, toys, books etc.** Please could you also consider donating a raffle prize.

SCHOOL PLAYTIMES

The lovely new playtime equipment purchased by the PTFA has now arrived in school. We have explained to the children that before they start using the equipment we are going to sort it all properly and store it so that it is easily accessible and won't get damaged.

Some parents have queried the Key Fob system we plan to start using. Please be assured this is set up in similar formats in the majority of schools and works well. If children accidentally lose an item they will not be penalised, but the system is in place to encourage the children to respect and take care of shared possessions. This is a valuable skill for all children to learn. Please do send in the slip printed below with the£1 deposit so that once the equipment is sorted out the children can begin to start their new playtime activities.
