
BRANSCOMBE C OF E PRIMARY SCHOOL NEWSLETTER 11 / 12 17 Friday 20th January 2012

Class 2 Tudor Day trip

As part of the Tudor topic that the children in KS2 are studying this term, we would very much like to take them to visit St Nicholas Priory in Exeter where they would be able to have firsthand experience of life during Tudor times. Over several weeks the children will be in role as they complete tasks set by the Priory in preparation for their visit. Dressed as Tudors, the children would have the chance to take part in a full day session run by the "Time Travellers" who would guide the children through aspects of Tudor architecture, costumes, meals, medicine and what it was like to live in a Tudor house. The Priory provides a wealth of resources for the children to complete both before and after their visit, including songs, dances and ideas for costumes. It is a completely interactive experience.

It would be an invaluable experience for the children but it does come at a cost, anticipated to be in the region of £16.00 per child to include entrance fee and transport. I appreciate that this exceeds the price of most of our school trips, so would appreciate you returning the slip below to show whether you are in favour of the trip and if you are willing to meet the voluntary contribution. Insufficient contributions will mean that the trip will not go ahead.
