## Dear Parents,

What a lovely first week back after Easter. The weather has been wonderful, perfect for our sponsored spring walk which took place on Wednesday this week. The children all did so well to complete the walks on such an unseasonably hot day, and I think they all enjoyed themselves. Ruby and Karen from the National Trust led them in some activities along the way, looking for spring plants and identifying the different trees – quite a challenge when many of them still have no leaves. As you know the walk was to raise money for our Community fund, please could we request that all sponsor money collected is handed in to the office by the end of next week. This term the National Trust sessions will continue to run, with the next one taking place on 20<sup>th</sup> May.



Also this term we are lucky to have been approached by the community team at Exeter Chiefs rugby club who will be running some sessions for class 2. This is part of a programme sponsored by Aviva which aims to improve young people's numeracy and financial literacy skills.
