

Community Fund News

A grand total of £219.50 was raised by the sponsored walk, well done to all those who took part and collected money. If you have not yet handed your sponsor money in, please bring it to the office as soon as possible. The children would like to make a donation from the community fund towards helping the people of Nepal. Having lived in Nepal for several years, Miss Moss has advised us on how best to get this money to those in need:

"INF (the International Nepal Fellowship) is a Christian medical mission working in health and development among some of the poorest people of Nepal. I worked for them for six years between 2000 and 2006 teaching the children of expatriate personnel. This week I have been in touch with friends and former colleagues who have been updating me on the current situation. Being in place within Nepal, INF were in a good position to respond immediately in distributing aid and relief following last weekend's devastating earthquake. They have already sent a medical team to the region at the epicentre of the earthquake (Gorkha) though they quickly ascertained that the primary need is for relief such as food, water and shelter. They are now loading trucks from their base in Pokhara to send food, tents and other essential items to those worst affected. You can find out more on their website (inf.org)."

Beer Blazer


10k, 5k and 1 mile fun run On Sunday 10th May. At Pecorama, Mare Lane Beer Races start 10.30am
