From the start of next term our school meals will be from a different provider. They will still be cooked at Sidmouth Primary School but they are being managed by an outside catering firm which specialises in school meals. There are details below about the new company — Aspens — and there is a copy of the new menu which we are sure you'll agree looks delicious.

Mrs Gray met with the manager this week and he is going to organise for a parent 'tasting' session early in the New Year.

All arrangements for ordering lunches will remain the same – it is always helpful if you can order your child's meals on a Friday the week before the meals are due to be taken, but we understand some changes may need to be made on the day. The children can choose from main meal, vegetarian, jacket potato or packed lunch option. Please do give the new meals a try if you don't usually order a school lunch for your child.

Netball Club


As we are nearing the end of term, there will be no netball club on Monday 18th December.
