Bikeability

We are very aware that due to the limited availability of different road conditions around Branscombe some of the children were disappointed that they were unable to complete the full bikeability course when it was organised last year. We are now able to provide you with information regarding courses that are available during the Easter holidays. Please see the information below which has been taken from the Bikeability website.

EASTER HOLIDAY BIKEABILITY LEVEL 2 DAYS!

Bikeability is the new cycle training scheme for the 21st century. Many adults will remember doing their Cycling Proficiency Test but Bikeability is designed to give the next generation the skills and confidence to ride their bikes on today's roads.

There are three Bikeability levels.

Level 1 is usually covered in a traffic free environment and teaches basic cycle skills for children from seven to nine years old.

Level 2 is covered on quiet roads but with real traffic conditions for children of ten years or older.

Level 3 is delivered on busier roads for children of secondary school age, who have already completed Level 2.

What are Level 2 days?

A "Level 2 day" is simply a fun and full day out where Bikeability Level 1 and 2 skills are taught in one day!

It will give trainees a real cycling experience so that they are able to deal with traffic on short journeys such as cycling to school or with your family.

It is for children aged 10 years (or are ten by the 31st August, if the course is in the summer term) and older for children who live in Devon. Parents are welcome to join too!

All participants must be able to ride independently and without stabilisers.

The sessions are conducted by one or more accredited Bikeability Instructors and together the trainee will embark on a journey on various cycling-friendly roads and paths around town. They will also learn how to do your own bike check and take on all exercises and road safety theory required to achieve Bikeability Level 2.

There is lots of cycling involved on the day, but trainees will also have to listen and learn from the instructor(s). They will be rewarded with an official Bikeability certificate and badge according to the level achieved. Trainees will also hopefully leave the session with a feeling of independence and be ready to make more cycle journeys – maybe to and from school or leisure rides with parents and friends.

What participants need to bring

Roadworthy bike & properly fitting cycle helmet Suitable clothing Drink and a packed lunch.

How much does it cost?

The training is free, funded by Devon County Council and the Department of Transport.

Instructors can also run 1:1 session for total beginners or those would prefer bespoke training. Contact the instructor for more details and costs. If this session is for a child the parent is required to attend the full session.

When and where?

Sessions start at 9 am prompt and finish at 4 pm. The name in brackets is the lead instructor. Their contact details are available further down this document.
