

## Cookery Club

We were pleased to learn this week that we have been awarded a grant which Mrs Crawford had worked hard in applying for earlier in the term. The grant called "Let's Get Cooking" is to help with the running costs of school cookery clubs which promote healthy eating. Next half term Cookery Club will start on Monday 7th March and will be open to Key Stage 2 children. This will be on a first come first served basis with a maximum of six children. If your child will be attending please complete the form below and provide a contribution of £1 towards the ingredients for the five week course.

### Exciting Post for Class 2

In literacy last term Class 2 were looking at how texts are structured. They focused initially on books which have an easy structure and we chose the famous 'That's not my...' series of books which many very young children enjoy. Once the children had noticed the repetitive structure they designed their own 'new' book for the series. The children were also learning about styles of letter writing so they then wrote a letter about their book design to Usborne publishers.

On Wednesday the author of the 'That's not my...' series wrote to the class and I have copied the letter here:

## Dear Class 2

Thank you for sending your wonderful ideas for new titles in the 'That's not my...' series and all your delightful letters. I love your drawings and the touchy-feely patches that you have used. You have all realised how the words work in the books - an adjective, such as rough, silky, fluffy, shiny, to describe the texture of the touchy-feely patch, and a noun to name each part of the body or object.

There would be problems using some of the touch-feely patches that some of you have suggested, especially the feathers, as each book has to have lots and lots of safety tests before they can be published. A baby might lick or try to chew the feathers, which wouldn't be very nice!

I am working on the 34th title in the series at the moment. I'm not allowed to say what it is before it's published, but one of you has chosen the same animal that the book is about. It's going to be published in September, so keep a look out in bookshops or on the Usborne Website to see what it is.

## **T-Shirts**

As a result of the children being more involved in inter-school sports events and a feeling that the children didn't seem to have much pride in their PE uniform, the governors recently approved a slight alteration to the school PE uniform. They agreed that a school logo on our white PE t-shirts would mean that the children would feel more like a team and more proud of the PE uniform. This change will be phased in gradually. New PE t-shirts will shortly be available in the office for those parents who wish to purchase one at a cost of £7.50. Although the younger children can buy them this change is mainly for the older children who get changed more regularly for PE lessons and visit other schools for PE events more often. Another change made by the governors was that children may now wear a dark coloured plain track suit over their blue shorts and white t-shirt to ensure they are warm during winter PE lessons.

## **BCG** Screening

In line with national policy, BCG vaccination for TB has not routinely been given to children in schools since 2005. NHS Devon are now screening young people aged 5 - 18 years old who are at risk of developing or have ongoing risk of exposure to TB infection. This includes any child aged 5-18 years old who has not been vaccinated against TB infection and:

Have a parent or grandparent born in a country with a high incidence of TB  $\ensuremath{\textit{OR}}$ 

Were born or lived for more than 3 months in any country with a high incidence of TB

If you feel that your child fits into either of the above groups please contact the Immunisation Team on **01392 208469/208470** to arrange screening and vaccination.

In addition to this all children in Reception will be sent a questionnaire that needs to be returned to school, for the attention of the School Nurse.
