

Dear Parents,

Before the disruption caused by the inclement weather conditions, the children in Class 1 enjoyed taking part in our latest 'Ready, Steady, Write' themed day, during which they all had the opportunity to partake in a range of activities, to explore the nursery rhyme 'Hey Diddle, Diddle'. First, they made cow puppets that were able to jump over the moon, which allowed them to practise using positional language. Following this they created stick puppets and story stones, to retell the rhyme. Finally they created mobiles to summarise the rhyme! Later in the afternoon, the children wrote a diary entry, recounting part of the rhyme, from the perspective of one of the characters. Excellent work was produced by all, and Miss Harvey-Jones was blown away by the imaginative ideas communicated in this creative writing task.

Our Reception pupils have had lots of fun, further improving our role-play zone: To encourage meaningful play in this area of the classroom, Miss Harvey-Jones left the design and construction of the castle to the children for this half term, and thus has been keen to let the children themselves, take responsibility for the props and décor. Last week the children enjoyed making platters and goblets to decorate their table for a medieval banquet, and have also created symmetrical shields, to adorn the walls of the 'great hallway'! Prior to their guests arriving for the party, they decided that they needed some entertainment for the festivities, and took musical instruments into the castle, for song and dance! This week their interests have moved towards finding out more about knights. The children had fun cutting out pictures of their faces to stick on paper and then using mixed media to create an image of themselves dressed in armour!

Meanwhile our pupils in Key Stage 1, have moved from 'paddling' to thinking more deeply, about our new text 'The Paper Bag Princess' by Robert Munsch. The children have been looking at the finer details of the story, to unpick the characteristics of Elizabeth, Ronald and the Dragon. They decided upon the best adjectives to describe these characters, and provided reasons for these choices, with evidence from the text. They then worked in pairs, to attempt to retell the tale, from differing points of view! Using their thinking about the different ways that a character is described and presented in a story, the children planned what their own good and bad characters would be like, to include in an invented fairy tale. They are looking forward to sharing their own fairy tales with you in this week's Sharing Assembly.

In this week's Science lesson, Class 2 built on the children's recent homework task, in which they were asked to observe the moon over a period of time, and make a moon diary. The children explored the reason why the moon appears to change shape. Using a football, half covered in black, to represent the moon with one side in sunlight, and the other half in shadow, the children drew sketches of the shapes they could see from different angles on black paper using chalk. They practised using some of the vocabulary that is used to describe the phases of the moon, such as 'waxing', 'waning', 'crescent' and 'gibbous'. The children observed that while the moon is waxing (getting larger), the right side is visible and the left side is in shadow, while when the moon is 'waning' (getting smaller), the left side of the moon is visible and the right side is in shadow. While the Year 6 children worked as a team to create a poster, explaining the phases of the moon, the younger children were challenged to order pictures of the moon's phases, and label these correctly, using the vocabulary they have learned. In the same lesson, reinforcing the

children's recent work on time in Maths, the children discussed the difference between lunar and calendar months, revising the number of days in each calendar month, and learning that a lunar month lasts for approximately 27 days.

The children also completed some cross-curricular Maths work in their Geography lesson this week. In this term's Geography lessons, the children have been using globes, maps and atlases to find out more about the planet we live on. This week, having revised the terms learned in previous weeks (latitude, longitude, equator, tropic of Cancer, tropic of Capricorn etc.) the children learned more about the polar regions of the northern and southern hemispheres. They were then challenged to create graphs, using data showing the number of daylight hours, in different months in the Arctic and/or Antarctic circles, and comparing this with London.

The week ended with more cross-curricular Maths learning, as the children celebrated World Book day. As they worked in groups to plan a cosy reading den, the children were challenged to measure and calculate the area of the spaces available, drawing scaled diagrams of these spaces. They were also challenged to consider, and plan the budget, that would be required for resources they may use, to make their reading den feel comfortable.

They have enjoyed roleplaying situations, where keeping the best for themselves and giving away what they might consider rubbish, is not really sharing compassionately. As a result of these conversations, the children and staff have decided that they are fortunate enough to be able to show compassion to others, by sharing that which we have, with those in less privileged positions. Therefore, as a school we have chosen to do something about this!

Over the coming weeks, we would like to invite you to join us in bringing in items for a collection to take to the Food Bank, at Saint Winifred's Church, and to do our part making food available to those who are in 'food crisis', having no food and no money with which to buy food.

The children have also learnt a little more about some of our local charity shops and the wider organisations that they are part of. We will be taking some of the children both to the church, and also to the shops in Sidmouth, to deliver our donations during the week commencing Monday 25th March, in our effort to support them in raising money towards their causes.

## **Times Table Rock Stars**

On Thursday 29th March, which is the last day of school this term, we are planning a special dress-up day in school in the style of 'Rock Stars'. We will be collecting donations in support of the Brain Tumour Research charity, for 'Wear a Hat' day – so please include a rock star hat or wig in your costume!
