Flora Cooking with Schools

We were delighted to hear that the preschool have been given a grant (from the Cooperative Community Fund) to buy a new cooker which children at school will also be able to use. What better time then, for the school to get involved in Flora's Cooking with Schools. In each tub of Flora there is a token code (on the paper cover inside) which you can allocate to a school of your choice. If we build up enough tokens we will be able to buy badly needed cooking equipment, such as measuring jugs and saucepans. The first time you use the Flora website it can seem confusing so here are a few instructions:

Log on to www.cookingwithschools.com. On that first screen look for Redeem Token and type in the token code from the paper on your margarine tub. Click GO. It asks you to do a security check and then asks for the town of your nominated school. Type in **Seaton**. It then asks you to select your school and Branscombe is in the list. Finally press Submit.

It does seem a little long winded but we really feel it is worth it because the equipment will make a real difference to your children's cooking in school. Thank you for your support.

Head Teacher's Report:

Katie expressed her thanks for all the hard work that had gone into the Summer Fair, and said how much it had been appreciated by many of the villagers as well as the children themselves.

She reported that cake sales continue to be much appreciated (by everyone's taste buds as much as for the money they generate) and expressed the hope that there will be enough support to see them continue this year.

New Play Area Proposed - Taking Pressure off School Playground

The National Trust has given its approval for a sustainable play area to be built in the corner of the field next to the school.

Hazel expressed concern about the amount this area would cost to build in a sustainable fashion (around £3,000) and queried whether the children could be escorted down to play in the existing playground next to the village hall instead. It was explained that, unfortunately, the chronic shortage of mealtime assistants means this won't be possible as you need two to accompany the children off-site and one to stay at school.

Plans for the play area are still to be considered, and should it go ahead, the children will be consulted regarding the equipment that's chosen.

Christmas Cards

It was agreed that these were very popular last year and Katie is currently in negotiations with a couple of printers to secure the best production deal. Every child will have the opportunity to design their own card and thanks to the teachers for coordinating the exercise.

School Fish Tank

Katie reported that the only immediate need for school is a replacement lid for the fish tank – around £30. However, it was agreed last year that the money raised from

the cake stalls would be used to replenish some classroom consumables. Staff did do an audit for this and Katie will give this shortly to April. She also expressed her thanks to Dominic, who has been coming in every night to feed the fish.

Matters Arising – The Term:

October

<u>Pub Quiz:</u> We need to get some money into the PTFA coffers and this has proved popular in the past, is a good money earner and easy to organise. So April suggested that another be organised for the last Thursday in October.

Whilst she expressed everyone's appreciation for the support the Mason's Arms has given the event for the last two years she suggested that, in the name of village democracy, we should ask The Fountain whether it would like to host the event this year. It was also felt this would be a good way of involving more parents from the west end of the village. Should this prove successful, then it was suggested that in future the quiz be held in alternate pubs each year.

April will liaise with both pubs and is also in contact with two quiz masters. The last Thursday at the end of October was suggested as a good date for the event.

November

<u>Pamper Night:</u> It was also proposed that we hold a Pamper Night one Friday in November. Due to her wide contacts within the field, April is confident she can persuade lots of therapists to attend and we are targeting ticket sales of around 100 – which will be dependent on parents inviting family and friends along.

The proposal is to charge £10 to include to 10-15 minute sessions plus nibbles (of food, as opposed to feet).

Having recently attended one of these evenings, Jess suggested that the event needs to be very carefully scheduled in order to ensure there is time for everyone to get their allocated therapies.

It was also suggested that we should ask local jewellery sellers etc if they'd like to take a stall.

Remembrance Day in conjunction with Village: this is scheduled for 11th November

<u>December</u> – brace yourselves, there's a lot going on!

<u>Christmas Play in Village Hall, Mon 8th Dec:</u> The PTFA will be providing a raffle and refreshments beforehand – eg non-alcoholic drinks, mince pies etc. Hazel, April and Faith have offered to help on the day.

<u>Christmas Lunch, Wed 10th Dec:</u> As usual, the PTFA will donate £500 towards this – money which has already been allocated. It was reiterated that all related receipts need to be carefully recorded.

<u>School Christmas Fair, Fri 12th Dec:</u> This is the proposed date, but we are checking to see whether or not it clashes with local late night shopping events. There was discussion as to whether it should be held at the village hall, but, overall, it was felt the school was the better venue (despite a bit of a dark walk up the hill to get there).

It has been proposed that we organise a <u>Christmas Fair Sub-Committee</u>, which will obviously welcome as many members as possible. The first meeting will be held at Hazel's lovely house at 6pm on Fri 16th December – "think of it as a social gathering, not a sub-committee", she advises.

Hazel will be speaking to all parents who kindly volunteered last year and ask them to do the same again in 2008 – however, more help is still very, very welcome as we did struggle to get enough volunteers.

Christmas Puddings: It has been decided that this year, instead of puddings, we will hold a craft activity evening where Hazel will supervise the children making Christmas tree decorations. She has proposed Thurs 4th Dec from 3.15pm (replacing the normal football activity which will have finished by then).

Santa's Grotto: It was agreed by all that the Grotto, very kindly constructed and donated by parents, is fantastic; but, unless you're a fully qualified chippie, it does take rather a long time to erect – and was the main reason for the late start of the fair last year. So this year it's proposed that Santa will snuggle up in a nice blue tent for the night – hopefully decorated by Class Three children if time allows.

April will be writing to Lapland to ask Santa if he can attend again as he proved very popular last year. She is also happy to be an elf on the night (but is unfortunately refusing to wear stripy tights, platforms and a mini skirt as was suggested – although maybe a small donation to the PTFA might change her mind on this one).

Any ideas for new stalls for the event would be welcome. There will be a 'Make a Wish' craft table and possibly a £1 Lucky Dip. Also all families will probably be asked to donate one wrapped present. April acknowledged the need to make money from the event, but also cautioned about striking a balance between it being too commercial and the children having a fantastic time and being able to afford to take part in lots of the events.

Hazel will be investigating the Exeter Scrap Store Warehouse in order to find out about getting craft materials for the evening. It was suggested that, as a local school, we can get up to £30 worth of stuff free.

<u>Christmas Open Afternoon, Mon 15th Dec:</u> There will be a chance to see the children's work from 2.15 – 4pm. Mince pies etc will be served.

<u>Christingle, Tuesday 16th Dec:</u> Refreshments for this event will be served in the church as it was felt that it didn't work particularly well serving them back at school.

Christmas Entertainment, Wed 17th Dec: April confirmed that she has booked Theatre Alibi to give a performance. The PTFTA will pay for all children's tickets (costing it £101.25) but it was hoped that we might be able to sell additional tickets to parents and siblings at a cost of £3-3.50 per adult ticket (the group can perform to a maximum of 160). The ticket price could include.... you guessed it, a cup of tea and a mince pie (but maybe we'll decide to switch to flapjacks or a nice healthy apple by this stage). The event will start at 2pm, ending at 3.15 and is being billed as 'family theatre' as opposed to children's entertainment. Do bring lots of guests as April has seen the group perform and says they're fab.

Other Matters Arising:

<u>School Disco:</u> Whilst it was acknowledged how much the kids love the discos, it was suggested that we wait until Valentine's Day 2009 to organise the next one as there is so much already going on this term.

It was suggested that, perhaps, instead of the normal disco, we ask Dylan's band to perform – which would be extremely popular with the children, given how much he's loved. It was also suggested that we might hold the event on a Sunday afternoon so that whole families can attend and boogie down together.

The new committee needs to be sworn in at a brief AGM. This will take place one night after school. Many of the previous committee have now left and so there will be a new proposal of the following members:
